### Rochdale Councillors seeking a 34% pay rise- Protest against Greed 14th December

UNISON members will be outraged to hear that just as we are being told we have to accept further austerity, councillors are set to consider voting themselves a 34% pay rise on 14th December. Council services are being cut back, staff are being made redundant, council workers are expected to swallow a permanent 1.25% pay cut (in the form of unpaid leave) and changes to pay progression that will cost us hundreds of pounds. The chief executive Steven Rumbelow thinks the councillors' pay claim is perfectly justified. How can this be?

### **Under pressure**

The Council have recently changed their proposal for cuts to staff terms and conditions. The threat to sick pay has been removed, UNISON welcomes this, however we feel it is a shame that it has taken the prospect of industrial action for councillors to rethink this proposal.

In addition to this they are willing to pay increments to those who are entitled to them in 2017, rather than extend the freeze on pay progression until 2018. Increments will still only be paid every two years under the new proposals.

These changes came after UNISON members voted 75% in favour of industrial action in the last indicative ballot. We do not believe the Council would have come forward with these changes if they did not believe our members were serious about striking.

### Still not good enough

However the proposal as it stands still means a permanent pay cut of 1.25% for the average council worker. It still means that some council workers who started working for the authority in 2012 will not reach the top of their pay scale by 2022. The cost of food, transport and utility bills are still going up. In real terms the value of your pay is over 20% down on what it was in 2010.

UNISON's stance is that you should not accept permanent changes to your contract that will mean you lose hundreds of pounds every year. We know that Rochdale is holding onto £127 million in reserves this year. Some of these reserves could be used instead of hitting council workers with yet more austerity.

### **UNISON** would like courage you to do three things:

- Return the second indicative ballot recently issued by 12<sup>th</sup> December and Vote YES to industrial action
- Join the protest outside the council meeting on Wednesday 14th December at 5.30pm at Rochdale Town Hall
- Get your friends to join UNISON
