## Pay Strike Begins Thursday 10th July

UNISON members in Local Government and schools have voted to go on strike over the latest below inflation pay offer. The first one day strike will take place on Thursday 10th July. We are striking for a pay rise of at least £1 per hour.

#### Inflation

We have suffered a pay freeze and years of below inflation rises that have cut our pay in real terms. If we accept this year's pay offer without a fight we will be, on average, 20% worse off than we were in 2010. The cost of living has risen but our pay is being held down.

#### Bubble

At the moment a new housing bubble is building up in London fuelled by the banks and a reckless housing policy. The Bank of England are talking about increasing interest rates to tackle the bubble. This will mean higher mortgages and rents for everyone. Housing costs, childcare and power bills will all be going up - without a decent pay rise we won't be able to keep up.

#### Pension

If you are in the Local Government Pension Scheme your pension is now calculated based on your average earnings over your career. Below inflation pay deals now will reduce the value of your pension when you retire.

#### Not alone

We are not alone in this fight. UNITE and GMB have both balloted their members for action. School teachers will be joining us on July 10th. It is likely that civil servants will also be on strike that day. We need to stand together.

#### Pay justice

UNISON represents thousands of low paid workers and part of our pay claim is for the Living Wage to be introduced for everyone in schools and Local Government. This would mean a new minimum of £7.65 per hour for the lowest paid. The Living Wage Commission recently recommended that the Government should implement the Living Wage in the public sector. The Living Wage is the minimum that people need to earn to afford the basic necessities for themselves and their families. By winning our strike we could force the Government to do the right thing on the Living Wage.

#### School Uniforms Scheme

UNISON is once more launching a scheme to help members on low incomes deal with the cost of school uniforms. Families with children living on a low income struggle constantly to make ends meet - and this can be particularly acute before the new school year begins when those extra costs hit hard.

The union's welfare charity There for You has once more set up a limited fund to help members on low incomes deal with the cost of school uniforms.

#### Austerity Isn't Working -March and Rally 6th September

UNISON members from Rochdale will be joining the TUC march and rally in Manchester on 6th September against the Government's austerity programme. The cuts in the NHS and the devastation of other local services are causing misery for ordinary working people. If you want to join the demonstration we will be meeting at Rochdale Train Station at 10am. If you would prefer to meet us in Manchester the march assembles at Castlefield Arena from 11am. ## Strike guide 10th July

#### Who is on Strike?

There has been a ballot and yes vote for strike action. So if you are a UNISON member and you work for the council or in schools (apart from Bamford Academy, Hollingworth Academy, St Anne's Academy and Wardle Academy you are on strike on 10th July (even if you voted against or did not vote- the majority voted in favour of strike action.)

#### Am I exempt from the strike?

The answer is probably not. In order to ensure "life and limb" cover UNISON will grant exemptions for certain posts. These exemptions are rare and apply to posts not individuals. You may be exempt if you are in the last year of service and have been given an end date by your employer. You may also be exempt if you are pregnant and have notified your manager of the expected date of the birth. All exemptions must be requested by management and confirmed by UNISON's Regional Secretary. If you think your post should be exempt please contact the branch- 01706 925952. Anyone who is exempt will be asked to make a contribution to the hardship fund.

#### Will striking affect my pension?

Taking one day of strike action will have a minimal effect on your pension and, if you want to, you can pay to make up your contributions after the strike. Whereas the effect of annual below inflation pay rises will have a massive impact on your pension. That's one of the reasons why we are striking.

#### I support the campaign but I am a worried that I cannot afford to strike?

We recognise that striking is hard for everyone. We are only taking this action because there is no other way to get a decent pay rise. UNISON has a hardship fund for members who are in financial difficulty as a result of taking strike action. You can contact Rochdale Unison on 01706 925292 to discuss this.
