## **Local Government Pay Review Update**

Members will be aware that there was a two year national local government pay settlement for 2018-2020. The award involved a minimum annual increase of 2% for most staff with higher increases for low paid members.

The increase due under the first year of the pay deal was implemented with effect from 1 April 2018, however the second year of the pay deal required local negotiations with Councils because grading structures vary across different authorities.



In our negotiations with Rochdale Council, UNISON had a number of objectives to ensure the increase is applied fairly:

- No member of staff to receive less than the Foundation Living Wage
- No detriment for any member of staff in any revised grades
- Where possible, decrease the amount of time it takes staff to progress to the top of their grade
- No increase to the amount of time it will take staff to reach the top of their grade
- The implementation of the pay increase due in 2019 20 to be in place with effect from 1 April 2019

The Branch is pleased to inform all members that we have achieved all of these outcomes. Increases in the lower graded posts will result in many lower paid members receiving additional pay and the reduction in the incremental points in some grades will mean affected staff will progress to the top of their grade quicker. Following consultation with our members on the proposal from the local authority, UNISON will now be moving forward to reach a collective agreement with the Council and the new grading structure – and associated pay rise – will come into effect from 1 April 2019.
