Cuts see rise in 15 minute home care visits

More councils in England are commissioning 15 minute home care visits for vulnerable peopleeven though the government claims that it wants to clamp down on rushed visits, reveals a new UNISON study. It showed that 110 councils commission 15 minute visits, which make up one in seven of all homecare visits.

General secretary Dave Prentis called the figures a scandal, adding that "what we are seeing is the institutionalisation of dangerously low levels of care which comprises the dignity of the elderly and vulnerable people in our community who rely on this care, and places unfair pressures on homecare workers."

And what that means for actual people was illustrated by one home care worker who told the union: "On my run there are a number of 15 minute visits. One visit is to a man in his midnineties who is very frail and slow to move, especially in the morning. I have been given 15 minutes to into his house, wake him up, assist him to the bathroom, give him a shower, help get him dry and dressed and then make his breakfast and make sure he takes his medication. I have told my organiser that this takes at least around 30 to 45 minutes. Her reply was that other workers can do it in this time."

Mr Prentis was clear about where responsibility for this lay.

"The government is cutting council budgets by 40% while the need for care continues to rise. This forces councils to spread the care budget thinner and thinner, trying to make it go round. This symbolises all that is wrong with our increasingly undignified and underfunded care system."

UNISON are therefore campaigning to get councils to sign up to the union's Ethical Care Charter. The charter sets minimum standards to protect the dignity and quality of life for people who need home care. It commits councils to making sure providers give workers the time and training to provide better quality care for thousands of service users who rely on it as well as a living wage. Change of details/email addresses

If you have recently changed your details i.e. moved address or work location it is important you let the Branch Office know as we need to ensure our records are up to date, so you can receive all the relevant information from UNISON.

How long do I have to belong to UNISON before I can get legal support for a workplace issue?

In UNISON a member can qualify for legal assistance after only four weeks of membership. The matter for which the member needs advice cannot be a pre-existing complaint. So a member can receive legal advice for an issue that has arisen only four weeks after membership has started, at the earliest.

If the issue or complaint is pre-existing, the member cannot be offered legal assistance on that particular matter. However this rule does not affect new members who join and bring equal pay claims as part of the union's mass litigation process. People who join the union in those circumstances will have their claims included in the litigation if there are legal merits in their claim. The four week rule will apply to them for all other legal services. The four week qualifying period will commence on the date that UNISON receives an appropriately completed application form.
