Workers Memorial Day Tuesday 28th April 2015

Rochdale UNISON will be taking part in the annual commemoration of workers who are injured and killed as a result of hazards at work.

Over 20,000 people die worldwide every year because of their work. Most of these because of exposure to dangerous substances. This year the theme for the day is "removing exposure to hazardous substances in the workplace"

Hazardous substances are found in almost every workplace in the UK and many workers have no protection against the possible effects, despite the fact that tens of thousands of workers have their health destroyed by asthma, dermatitis, lung disorders and cancers because of exposures. They range from cleaning fluids in almost every workplace, silica dust in construction, tobacco smoke in prisons right through to blood and faeces in health and social care.

At 1:00pm on Tuesday 28th April a wreath will be laid by the Rochdale UNISON memorial tree in the Memorial Gardens opposite Rochdale Town Hall, along with two minutes silence as a mark of respect. All are welcome.

Make Rochdale A Living Wage Town

Did you know that nearly a quarter of all working people in Rochdale earn less than the Living Wage? The Living Wage is £7.85 per hour and is the minimum income the average person needs for a basic standard of living. Rochdale Trades Council will be holding a meeting to begin a campaign to make Rochdale a Living Wage town on Saturday 18th April. The meeting will be held at St Chad's Church, St Chad's Fold, Sparrow Hill, Rochdale, OL16 1QT and starts at 3pm. All welcome.

Emergency food for local people in need!

Rochdale UNISON Branch office holds a collection box for Rochdale Food bank, we collect items such as tins, boxed food, jars and sachets (not fresh food). The food is then donated to the Food bank for local people in need. Change of details/email addresses

If you have recently changed your details i.e. moved address or work location it is important you let the Branch Office know as we need to ensure our records are up to date, so you can receive all the relevant information from UNISON.

Salary Sacrifice Advice

The Council is introducing a salary sacrifice scheme (staff benefit scheme). Members have been asking our advice about this. The way that salary sacrifice schemes work is that the employee gives up some of their salary in return for a benefit (e.g. a car parking permit).

The advantage to the employer is that they can save money by avoiding paying national insurance contributions because your salary is less. The advantage to you is that you pay less national insurance and tax because your salary is less.

So for example Doreen buys a car through the Green Car Scheme that costs £1200 and pays it off over a year, her normal monthly pay is £1250 a month. Her salary would be reduced by £100 per month. But the income tax and national insurance she pays will also be reduced because she would only be taxed on £1150 a month.

Members need to be aware that sacrificing your salary will affect your workplace pension. Our pensions are now career average pensions rather than final salary pensions. This means that any reduction in your pay now will affect your pension when you retire.

Salary sacrifice can also affect the amount of maternity pay you are entitled to and it may make it more difficult to get a mortgage. Please seek independent financial advice before making a decision on salary sacrifice.
