### **Rochdale UNISON welcomes Living Wage**

Rochdale UNISON welcome the introduction of the Living Wage for all council employees. The raise was agreed after negotiations between the unions and the council. The Living Wage is £7.85 per hour and over 1000 workers including schools will get a pay rise as a result of the increase.

The idea behind a living wage is very simple: that a person should be paid enough to live decently and to adequately provide for their family. At its heart is an ethical argument for preventing in-work poverty and ensuring workers are not exploited through low wages.

Maureen Howarth, Branch Secretary, commenting on the council's decision said:

This will make a big difference for our lowest paid members. We are aware that every penny counts at the moment. We now hope that other employers will follow suit and do the right thing by hard working people providing vital services. UNISON will continue to campaign with others to make this happen.

There will be a meeting on Saturday 18th April at 3pm to begin a campaign to make Rochdale a Living Wage town. St Chad's Church, St Chad's Fold, Sparrow Hill, Rochdale, OL16 1QT- All welcome.

Rochdale UNISON will be taking part in the annual commemoration of workers who are injured and killed as a result of hazards at work.

At 1:00pm on Tuesday 28th April a wreath will be laid by the Rochdale UNISON memorial tree in the Memorial Gardens opposite Rochdale Town Hall, along with two minutes silence as a mark of respect. All are welcome.

### New pay campaign for 2015

Many UNISON members were disappointed with the way the pay dispute was ended last year. Rochdale UNISON was one of a number of branches to call for a special conference to discuss the pay campaign. The conference met on 24th March in London. The conference agreed to amend the local government service group's procedures to ensure that "meaningful, clear and transparent" consultation is carried out with branches.

It also called for at least one lay representative from the appropriate sector committees to have the opportunity to be involved in all pay negotiations.

Conference also called on the union to lodge an additional pay claim for 2015/16 with a settlement date of 1 April 2015 to include a Living Wage rate as the minimum pay and an equivalent flat rate pay increase to be applied to all other scale points. We will keep members informed about the next steps in the campaign.
