# **TTO Campaign Update**

RBC started a 45 day consultation period with UNISON on the 7<sup>th</sup> April which runs till 22<sup>nd</sup> May.

This is as a direct result of the collective Grievance that UNISON submitted in December 2019, regarding the TTO calculation and statutory leave entitlement.

#### **TTO Calculation**

Across Greater Manchester it has been established that there are a range of practices in relation to the TTO calculation with some Councils' calculations being more favourable than the LGA guidance and others less favourable. Rochdale Council's current calculation is less favourable.

Having reviewed the LGA guidance it would appear the Rochdale Council's current TTO calculation is now incorrect as it uses a denominator of 52 weeks when in fact an All Year Round (AYR) employee does not have to work 52 weeks in order to receive their full annual leave entitlement.

According to the LGA guidance the correct way to calculate how much leave a TTO employee is entitled to, is to compare the number of weeks a term-time employee works with the number of weeks an AYR employee works and give them a proportionate number of day's annual leave.

### **Statutory Leave Entitlement**

The current interpretation of these regulations is a result of Harpur Trust v Brazel (2019) IRLR 1012 CA. The Court of Appeal held that the holiday entitlement of term-time workers should not be prorated to that of full-year workers.

The Harpur Trust v Brazel (2019) IRLR 1012 CA is due to be heard by the Supreme Court and has been listed for 9 November 2021.

It has been identified that Council and School staff who fall below the statutory minimum of 28 days leave entitlement are:

- (a) TTO staff working 190/195 days based on 24 days annual leave
- (b) TTO staff working 190 days based on 25 days annual leave

### **Back Pay**

RBC are proposing to amend annual leave entitlements for TTO staff so they reflect your national terms and conditions and statutory requirements.

The Council have also stated that they intend to pay back-pay to 1 April 2019 because that is when further TTO guidance was issued by the LGA, however UNISON believes that the offer of back-pay is insufficient. The underpayment of annual leave is a historic issue which goes back prior to April 2019. UNISON formally lodged a grievance in December 2019 and other local authorities, including Greenwich and other London Boroughs, have settled at back-pay worth 5 years and 3 months.

UNISON will formally respond to the council to make the case for further back-pay, and for contributions relating to pension, but we need input from members to inform our response to the consultation.

UNISON are planning a ZOOM meeting regarding the TTO Campaign at 5pm on the 4th May 2021. If you wish to attend the meeting please email unison@rochdale.gov.uk for the meeting link. ### **Local Government & National Conference**
